13. Independence in daily living? (Demonstrated ability of an individual to provide for his or her own basic care without outside assistance such as: Vocational development outside the living arrangement which enables individuals to participate in the workforce such as using on-the job skills, riding a bus and crossing streets. Personal care, i.e., maintaining own hygiene, personal space and social relationships. Participation in citizenship activities such as awareness of community norms, voting and volunteering in community projects.)		
14. Economic self-sufficiency? (The managing of financial resources which are needed to satisfy the daily needs of an individual including at least involvement in commerce, such as managing money, comparative shopping, informed selection of foods, diet and purchasing and negotiating.)		
15. Community integration? (On-going participation in community life including at least the following: The amount of time spent out of the living arrangement in generic (non-disability) related activities such as church, Y.M.C.A, Y.W.C.A, education, libraries, clubs, shopping and amusements; participation in family activities and celebrations such as holidays, reunions, communication (telephone and mail) and vacations.)

23. Does the ISP adequately address any right restrictions and/or the use of any restrictive interventions (inclusive of the prior attempts to use lesser restrictive interventions and plan to reduce/eliminate the need for the restriction)?		
24. Is the ISP comprehensive—does it refer to and/or include service goals being used by all applicable service providers, including residential and, if applicable, day program and therapies?
