



Healthy Kids need checkups for preschool, Head Start, school, camp, childcare, sports programs, WIC and just to stay healthy!

Having HFS medical benefits means you can take your child to the doctor for a checkup, to the dentist for a cleaning or for treatment, such as to fill a cavity, or to the eye doctor to get a prescription for glasses. It means they can get all the care they need to stay healthy.

Babies, kids, teens and children with disabilities who get HFS medical benefits can get **FREE** checkups through age 20.

Healthy Kids checkups include:

- Head to toe exam
- Checks for growth and development
- Immunizations (shots)
- Checks of eyesight, hearing and teeth
- Advice about healthy eating
- Answers to your health questions
- Checks of emotions and behavior
- Referrals to special services if your child needs them

If you have questions about checkups for your child, call your doctor. If you need help to find a doctor or make an appointment, call Illinois Health Connect at 1-877-912-1999 (TTY: 1-866-565-8577). If you live in one of the following counties call the Illinois Client Enrollment Broker at 1-877-912-8880 (TTY: 1-866-565-8576): Adams, Brown, Cook, Henry, Jackson, Kane, Lee, Madison, McHenry, Mercer, Perry, Pike, Randolph, Rock Island, Scott, St. Clair, Washington or Williamson. The call is free. Or, you may call your managed care organization (MCO) if your medical card shows that you are enrolled in an MCO.

Remember, even young children need good dental care so they do not get cavities or toothaches. Take your child to a dentist regularly starting no later than age one. If you need help to find a dentist, call 1-888-286-2447 (TTY: 1-800-466-7566). The call is free.

If your child is enrolled in All Kids Assist, Share or Premium Level 1, or has a MediPlan card, you may get help with transportation to your doctor or dentist. If you have an All Kids card, check the back of the card to find your child's All Kids plan. Call 1-877-725-0569 (TTY: 1-877-204-1012) to find a transportation provider. The call is free.

Be sure to use all the benefits your MediPlan or All Kids card covers for your children.

Please be sure your child stays healthy by getting their recommended shots!
Has your child been immunized? Getting your child the recommended immunizations for their age is very important! A child who has not been adequately immunized may get sick, become disabled, or could even die.

Note: for the 2012-2013 school year the State requires children entering the 6th and 9th grade to have had a current Tdap shot to prevent the spread of Whooping cough (Pertussis).

The chart below provides you with a listing of immunizations your child should receive and at what age they should receive them. If your child has not had the recommended immunizations, call your doctor or local health department to make an appointment right away! If you need help finding a provider or making an appointment, call Illinois Health Connect at **1-877-912-1999 (TTY: 1-866-565-8577)**. The call is free.

Age	Vaccines (Shots)
Birth	Hepatitis B (Hep B)
1-2 months	Hepatitis B (Hep B)
2 months	Rotavirus, Diphtheria, Tetanus and acellular Pertussis (DTaP), Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib), Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV), Polio (IPV)
4 months	Rotavirus, Diphtheria, Tetanus and acellular Pertussis (DTaP), Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib), Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV), Polio (IPV)
6 months	Rotavirus, Diphtheria, Tetanus and acellular Pertussis (DTaP) Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib), Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV)
6-18 months	Hepatitis B (Hep B) , Polio (IPV)
6 months-18 years	Influenza (flu) (yearly)
12-15 months	Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib), Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (PCV), Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR), Varicella (chicken pox)
12-23 months	Hepatitis A (Hep A) (2 doses)
15-18 months	Diphtheria, Tetanus and acellular Pertussis (DTaP)
4-6 years	Diphtheria, Tetanus and acellular Pertussis (DTaP), Polio (IPV), Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR), Varicella (chicken pox)
11-12 years	Tetanus, Diphtheria and acellular Pertussis (Tdap), Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) for girls (3 doses), Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine (MCV)
9-18 years	Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) for boys (3 doses) is suggested.
